

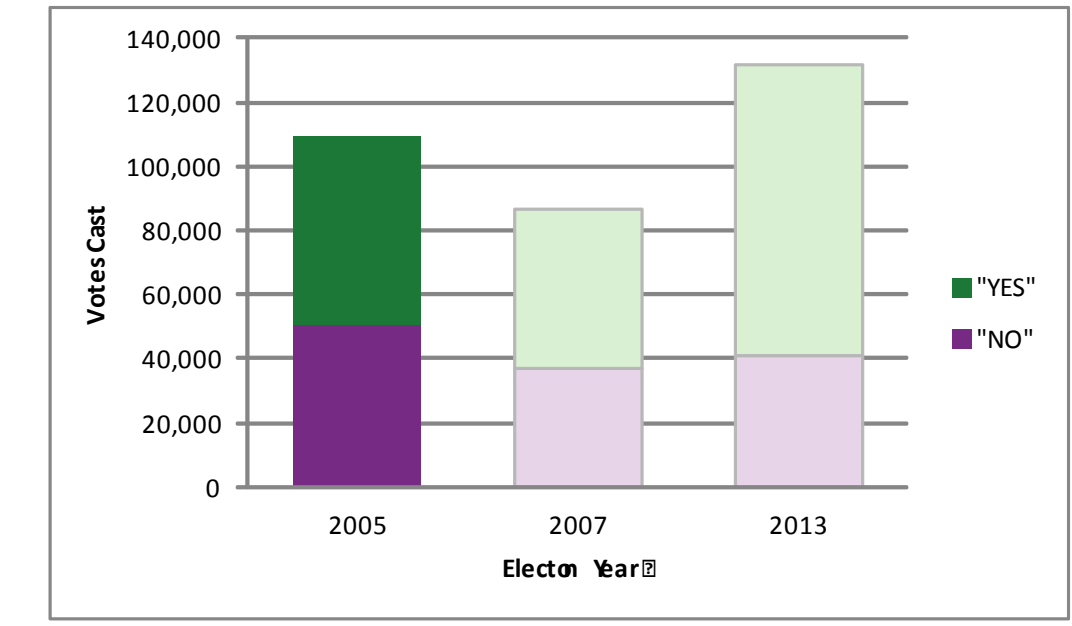
## Marijuana: Legalize Possession of Less Than One Ounce

### Initiated Question 100\*

Shall the voters for the City and County of Denver adopt an amendment to the Denver Revised Municipal Code that would make legal the private use and possession of one ounce or less of marijuana for any person 21 years of age or older?

**Citywide Results**  
Total Votes: 109,625  
"YES" Votes: 58,866 - 53.70%  
"NO" Votes: 50,759 - 46.30%

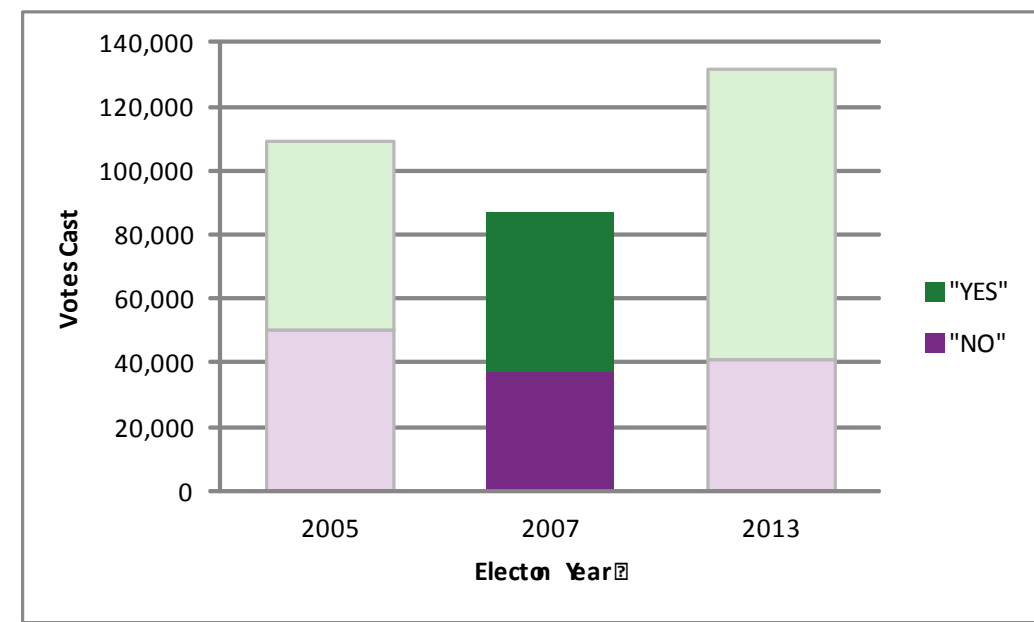
## Marijuana: Make Private Use and Possession the Lowest Law-Enforcement Priority

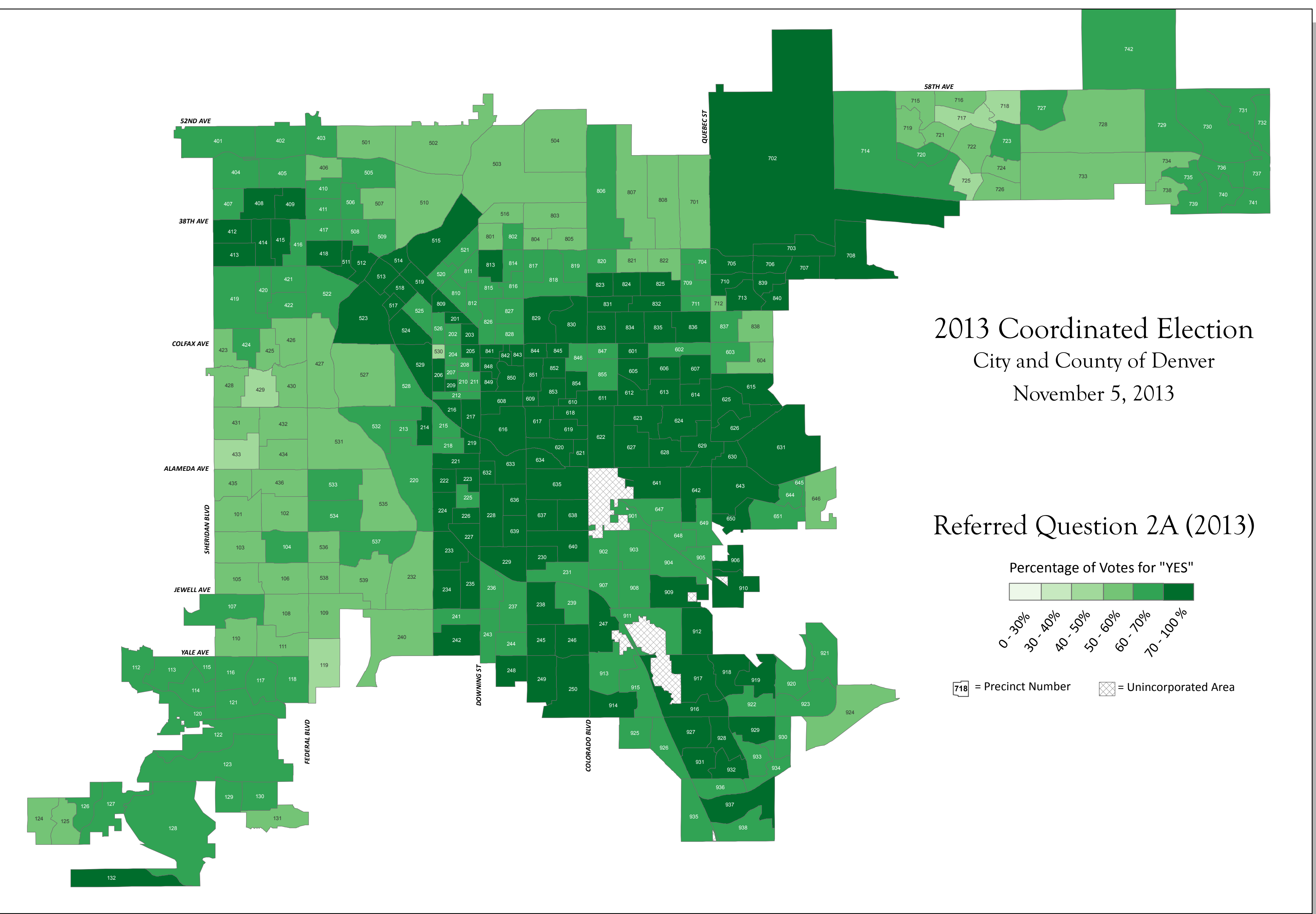
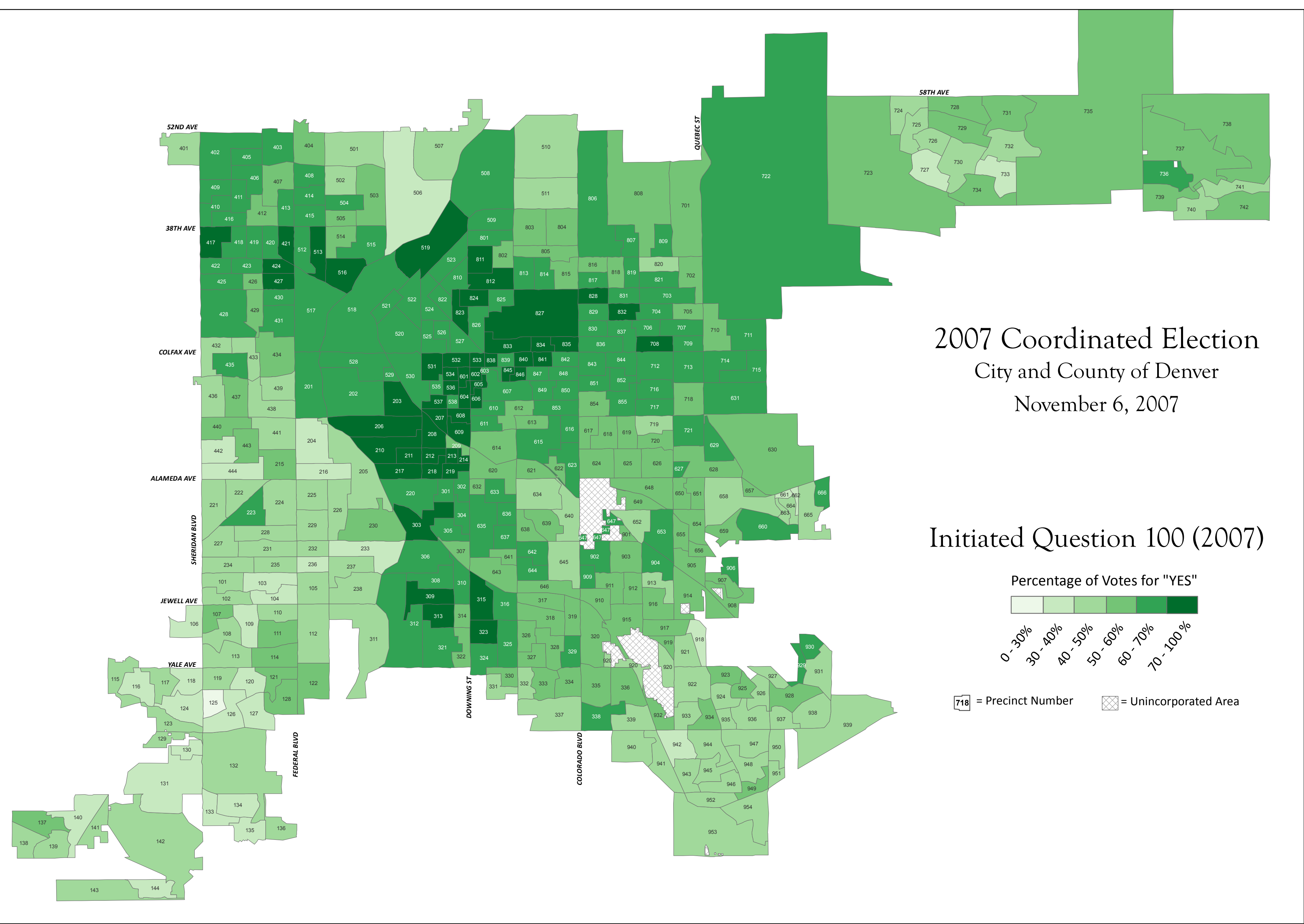
### Initiated Question 100\*

Shall the voters for the City and County of Denver adopt an ordinance to the Denver Revised Municipal Code that would make the private use and possession of marijuana by persons 21 years of age and older the City's lowest law-enforcement priority?

Total Votes: 86,862  
"YES" Votes: 49,573 - 57.07%  
"NO" Votes: 37,289 - 42.93%

## Marijuana: Denver Sales Tax

### Referred Question 2A

SHALL CITY TAXES BE INCREASED BY \$4.48 MILLION ANNUALLY IN THE FIRST FULL FISCAL YEAR AND BY SUCH AMOUNTS AS ARE RAISED ANNUALLY THEREAFTER BY IMPOSING AN ADDITIONAL SALES TAX OF 3.5% ON THE SALE OF RETAIL MARIJUANA AND RETAIL MARIJUANA PRODUCTS, WITH THE TAX REVENUES BEING USED TO FUND THE ENFORCEMENT OF REGULATIONS ON THE RETAIL MARIJUANA INDUSTRY, OTHER COSTS RELATED TO ENFORCEMENT OF MARIJUANA LAWS, EDUCATION AND PUBLIC HEALTH PROGRAMS ASSOCIATED WITH MARIJUANA CONSUMPTION INCLUDING PREVENTION OF UNDERAGE CONSUMPTION, AND OTHER CITY EXPENSES, WITH THE RATE OF THE TAX BEING ALLOWED TO BE INCREASED OR DECREASED WITHOUT FURTHER VOTER APPROVAL SO LONG AS THE RATE OF TAXATION DOES NOT EXCEED 15%, AND WITH THE RESULTING TAX REVENUE BEING ALLOWED TO BE COLLECTED AND SPENT NOTWITHSTANDING ANY LIMITATIONS PROVIDED BY LAW?"

"YES" Votes: 90,401 - 68.54%  
"NO" Votes: 41,501 - 31.46%
